說明：

一、依據駐加拿大代表處經濟總本（102）年3月4日加經（13）字第10200000620號函（如附件1）辦理。

二、CBSA頃於本年3月1日致函通知我方（如附件2）已於同日公告展開旨揭複查，相關重點略以（完整公告如附件3、複查期程如附件4）：

（一）本次複查範圍不包括售價在加幣225元以上之自行車以及可折疊式自行車；

（二）欲參與本次複查之外國出口商，須於本年4月12日前填復完整問卷（須逕向CBSA索取）以及正確資訊，否則其反傾銷稅將為出口價格之64%。

（三）倘我商已提供完整資訊，CBSA可能事先通知相關廠商，要求進行實地訪查（verification visits）。

I am writing to inform you that the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has today initiated a re-investigation to update the normal values and export prices respecting certain bicycles originating in or exported from Chinese Taipei and the People's Republic of China (China).

The re-investigation is part of the ongoing enforcement of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's order issued on December 7, 2012.

As part of the re-investigation, the CBSA is requesting information from exporters of the subject goods in your country. Should these firms provide complete information to the CBSA, verification visits at their premises may be scheduled. You will be notified in advance of any such visits.



Notice of Re-investigation - BICYCLES

Ottawa, March 1, 2013

The **Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA)** has initiated a re-investigation of the normal values and export prices of certain bicycles originating in or exported from Chinese Taipei and the People's Republic of China (China). Interested parties should note that the CBSA's practice of issuing interim normal values for this case is being discontinued.

The subject goods are described as bicycles, assembled or unassembled, with wheel diameters of 16 inches (40.64 cm) and greater originating in or exported from

Chinese Taipei and China, excluding bicycles with an FOB Chinese Taipei or China selling price exceeding CAD\$225, and excluding bicycles with foldable frames and stems.

The re-investigation is part of the CBSA's ongoing enforcement of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's (Tribunal) finding of December 11, 1992. This finding was subsequently reviewed and continued on December 10, 1997, December 9, 2002, December 10, 2007, and December 7, 2012.

The subject goods are normally imported into Canada under one of the following ten-digit Harmonized System classification numbers:

8712.00.00.12
8712.00.00.20
8712.00.00.30
8712.00.00.40
8712.00.00.50
8712.00.00.90

It is anticipated that this re-investigation will be concluded by July 26, 2013. A re-investigation schedule is available below and at:

The CBSA has requested information relating to the subject goods from possible exporters and importers of subject goods. All parties have been clearly advised of the CBSA's information requirements and the time frames for providing their responses.

Exporters that wish to participate are required to provide a complete and accurate submission by April 12, 2013. Importers are advised that where an exporter of subject goods fails to provide a complete and accurate submission, anti-dumping duties will be assessed at the rate of 64% of the export price of all future importations of the subject goods, in accordance with a ministerial specification pursuant to section 29 of the *Special Import Measures Act*. Furthermore, if an exporter fails to provide a complete and accurate submission, the finalized 2013 normal values will be based on the best information available. This may result in retroactive assessments of additional anti-dumping duties against the importer as high as 64% of the export price by means of ministerial specification.

Importers are cautioned that the cost of production information on which the interim normal values of the 2013 models were based will be verified during the current re-investigation. If any of the information provided by the exporters to determine those values is found to be inaccurate, the normal values will be re-determined and the entries reappraised in light of the new information. This may result in additional anti-dumping duties being assessed against the importer. Responses to the Importer Request for Information are due by March 22, 2013.

The timeline of the 2013 re-investigation is as follows:

March 1, 2013 – Initiation of Re-investigation

April 12, 2013 – Exporter Responses to the RFI due

July 26, 2013 – Conclusion of Re-investigation and issuance of exporter specific factors

July 26, 2013 to September 30, 2013 – Exporters request normal values for 2014 models from the CBSA.

October 31, 2013 – CBSA to issue all 2014 model normal values to exporters by this date

After October 31, 2013 no further normal values will be issued until another re-investigation is concluded or until an importer requests a re-determination of normal values after paying any duties owing on an importation and the CBSA is provided with the necessary information by the exporter to determine a specific normal value. All bicycle models without pre-established normal values will be assessed anti-dumping duty based on an advance over export price of 64% by means of ministerial specification.

Cooperative exporters can continue to request interim normal values under the current system until May 31, 2013. On August 31, 2013 all interim normal values previously issued by the CBSA will expire as was communicated to interested parties at the time the interim normal values were issued.
